Social Economic Profile of the Beneficiaries:

- Thegitasaratifoundation7 serves a children where most of people are migrant labor, sweepers, and street vendors whose migrated from impoverished rural villages in search of opportunities to cities and end up in slums as they neither have education nor skills to earn a decent living.
- In this area most of the people are maid servants, street vendors, sweepers and daily wages labors. The average income of families is less than Rs.8000/- and the average number of children in these families are 3 to 4.

. “The S.P. Camp Education Centre was officially inaugurated on 16 December 2026 in New Delhi, beginning its journey with 30 students.”

“In the S.P. Camp area, there were no nearby teaching facilities, and many children were deprived of basic education as they were unable to attend school. To bridge this gap, the S.P. Camp Education Centre was established, ensuring access to learning opportunities for all children in the community.”

. The Patel Camp Education Centre in New Delhi was established with an initial enrollment of 25 students.”

“In Patel Camp, due to the absence of educational resources, many children were involved in child labour. Our organization took active steps to address this issue by discouraging child labour and promoting education. With the establishment of the Patel Camp Education Centre, we strive towards our mission of ensuring that every child learns and progresses in life

. The Mathura Education Centre was established with an initial enrollment of 35 students.”

In Mathura, through our on-ground surveys, we identified that children from marginalized and disadvantaged communities were often denied access to education. Understanding the urgency of this issue, the founders of The Gita Saraswati Foundation, Manav Kumar and Ankush Kumar, established the Mathura Education Centre to promote inclusive education and ensure that every child, regardless of background, gets the opportunity to learn and grow
